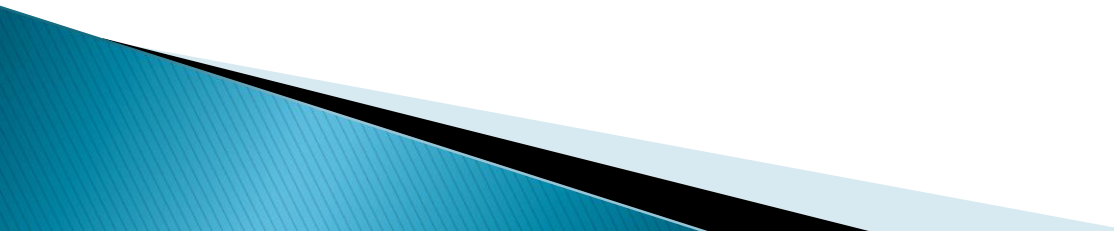

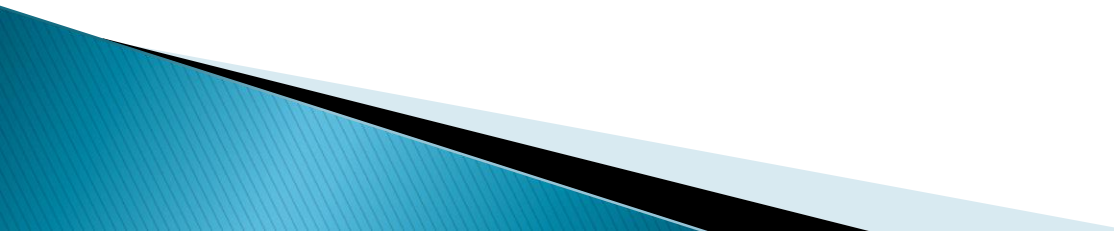
Concept of Child Labour

- ▶ The problem of child labour manifests in two different forms: in one child labour is used without any remuneration and in the other, it is paid mere subsistence wage.


Causes of Child Labour

- 

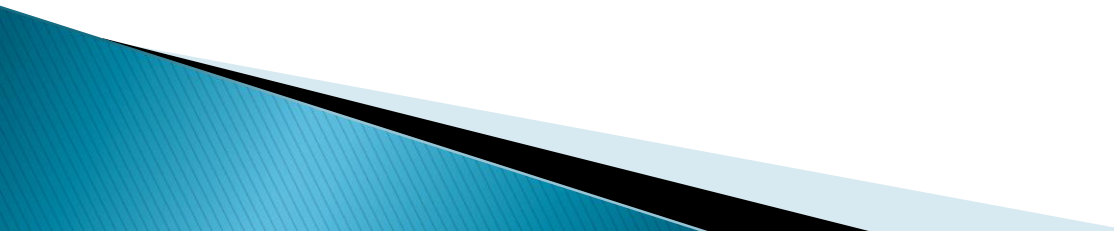
The Worst Forms Of Child Abuses


